In the "Feral pigs and the environment: an annotated bibliography", the authors examine the scientific literature to assess the impact of feral hogs on their environment. this paper emphasizes studies conducted in areas where feral hogs are exotic species, but it has also included those conducted within their native range, along with papers dealing with the management of feral hogs.
