This joint publication is the main result of a multidisciplinary initiative funded by the AsiaProEco programme of the European Commission. During 16 months, five Vietnamese and Thai research institutes and two European partners joined forces to study environmental pollution due to pig production in Northern Vietnam, through the example of Thai Binh province located in the Red River Delta. Its coverage of the outstanding livestock development issues and environmental externalities ranges from details of on-farm management practices to the balance of nutrients at regional level and the perceptions of society to suggest alternative strategies. It brings together satellite images, background issues and findings to guide researchers and policymakers in their domestic policies on agriculture and livestock with regard to environmental protection. These unique references aim to support the decision makers to balance economy and environment through innovative organizations, technologies and management options.
